## **Trefor Lloyd brief PROFILE**

**Trefor Lloyd** (whom has worked with UUU, Young Men's Unit, Youth Action N.I. and former Health Promotion Agency on research and capacity training) has also worked on 'Boys and Young Men's Health – What works – NHS Health Development Agency 2002', 'Practice Examples' and 'Literature and Practice review' NHS and much more.

Trefor Lloyd has been involved in developing work with boys and young men since 1982. He co-founded *The B Team* in 1985 to produce useful resources and publications for those developing work with men, and *Working With Men* to provide training and consultancy and a subscription journal to the same professionals. He is the Director of *Working With Men* that now provides a range of projects with boys, young men and fathers in London (see [www.workingwithmen.org](http://www.workingwithmen.org)).
